1. What this is

*T*alk into your phone. Open whatever you have just been reading or writing, let it set you off, and ramble. Order does not matter. We can sort that.

The reason is simple. Reordering thoughts is cheap. Producing them is hard. The hard part is the human part, so we lower the cost of doing it.

What you say goes into a database. Your actual words, tagged as primary source. The next time anyone asks Claude what CAQ thinks about coaching, the answer comes out of that database, not out of Claude's general knowledge.

Captured human words sit higher than anything Claude generates. When a future session has to choose between something a human said and something Claude might infer, the human one wins.

The more that gets captured, the more useful Claude gets at everything else. The work improves with every conversation that has been recorded.

Humans do the deciding. AI does the office work. The capture is the bit that holds those two roles in place.

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
